European Junior Swimming Championships – Helsinki, Finland

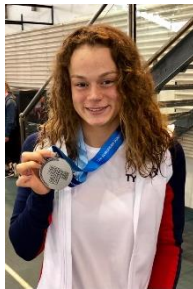

Congratulations to Solihull Men's Water Polo Team

March of this year saw Solihull Men's Water Polo team win the British Water Polo League Super5s and this was followed up at the beginning of June by the same team winning the British Championships thus becoming double British champions for 2018.

All of this has been achieved by a team which first entered the BWPL with a very young team as recently as 2012. They won Division Five in their first year and then gained successive promotions from Division Five through to Division One where they finished 3rd last year. Now they have completed this success story by becoming Division One champions and also winners of the British Championships.

Whilst achieving this success at the elite end of the sport, Solihull continues to be very focused on junior development and this was reflected by a total of 9 boys and 3 girls from the club representing their region in the recent under 16 inter-regional championships.

All of this has happened despite having very inadequate pools in which to train and play matches and much credit must be given to the Head Coach, Phil Powell, whose initiative, skill and dedication has enabled the players to overcome these hurdles with such great success.

Updates and General Information for SwimMark Clubs

SwimMark Updates

- Clubmark – Swim England has recently been made aware that the Sainsbury's Active Kids scheme is no longer a Clubmark benefit.
- A quick reminder that SwimMark accredited clubs receive a 5% on the cost of Swim England Awards - <http://www.swimming.org/swimengland/swim-england-club-awards/>.
- UK Coaching now offer three versions of their online renewal, which are all accepted by Swim England for SwimMark accreditations.
 - Safeguarding and Protecting Children (75 mins) – includes the core refresher module plus the Safe Communication with Digital Kids module
 - Safeguarding and Protecting Children (60 mins) – includes the core refresher module plus the Safeguarding Deaf and Disabled Children module
 - Safeguarding and Protecting Children (75 mins) – includes the core refresher module plus the Positive Parents module

Please note that prior to completing any of the above online renewals individuals must have initially attended UK Coaching face-to-face training.

General Updates

- The final wave of the Swim England 2018 National Awards are now open – <http://www.swimming.org/swimengland/final-wave-swim-england-national-awards-2018-open/>. These awards are a great opportunity to recognise all those involved in aquatics and we therefore want to encourage as many nominations as possible.
- CIMSPA & UK Coaching recently launched the coaching professional standards (https://www.cimspa.co.uk/article.php?group_id=4516), which provide an agreed reference point of the knowledge, skills and behaviours required of coaching assistants and coaches. This information will not only inform the development of future coaching qualifications and training but also support the effective deployment of coaches. The development of the Coach and Coaching Assistant standards included direct consultation with a wide range of sporting bodies, before an open consultation with the wider sector.

Important Updates for Clubs



We've updated our employment and consultancy contract templates for clubs

You may be aware that we updated the template contracts and guidance note in July 2014. Since this time there have been developments in the law relating to individuals employment status.

Our template agreements, and guidance note, have been reviewed and updated with the assistance of the law firm Browne Jacobson. A message to all West Midlands Clubs from the Regional Chair Simon Kirkland



To West Midlands Swimming Clubs,

At recent West Midlands swimming board meetings we have discussed the issue of club learn to swim programmes being under threat from the pool operators wishing to provide their own programmes. It was raised that the perception was that Swim England and the region were supportive of pool operators delivering learn to swim programme as opposed to clubs.

Can I say this is far from the truth. As a West Midlands board we want to see strong, vibrant sustainable clubs with a broad range of opportunities for people to swim and if they wish, progress through a talent pathway.

Unfortunately we have little or no influence over the programming of pools across the region. However, we can help with lobbying and discussing with the pool owners which are predominantly local authorities, to try and influence them to maintaining and increasing club swimming in their pools.

This is particularly the case when a new or refurbishment of a pool is being proposed. In these cases through Swim England, centrally we can provide clubs with data and information that make the case for clubs. Furthermore with all local authority facility developments, comes public consultation and this is where working with the county, ourselves and Swim England centrally we can lobby for you, the club.

I hope that clarifies that we are working behind the scenes and will continue to do so, to support the growth of swimming clubs in the West Midlands.
